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Director's Report

After many years of listening to children from communities across the greater Hamilton area, and of creating opportunities for children to speak to their communities through their art, programming began shifting towards providing opportunities for children to communicate directly with one another.

In 2016, the Artasia Listening Project, in partnership with Suzie Miller, brought children together to share their deepest feelings about their lives and needs with one another. This year now carries the voices of children beyond the community, as the Canada 150 I Have a Right ...J'ai un droit project has opened opportunities for children to activate the Hamilton Charter of Rights of Children and Youth by sharing their thoughts about their favourite of the 18 rights created by Hamilton children with notable Canadians both locally and nationally.

Following the successful exhibition at the Art Gallery of Hamilton, we toured and presented our project in Toronto and Winnipeg, sharing the learnings from the "Hamilton model" of empowering children's voice and participation. The word is spreading beyond our community!

This relationship will grow in parallel with our focus on early years, O-6, partnership with the Hamilton Early Years. Together we will start from the individual, to the neighbourhood, region, province, country, engaging the world's youngest constituents.

To support all the ideas we would like to develop, our have started to create equal attention to different approaches of working with our board, community and funders to diversify our financial streams. We are expanding our partnerships with community support, corporations and other businesses, and will be introducing CKA to HCA families who look for ways to be involved. Together enacting that participation in the arts is a right not a privilege.

We encourage all of you to join our charitable campaign to help sustain our vision. When we all chip in, every contribution will do a little bit to move the vision forward. Each time we donate, another child will gain the opportunity to participate in accessible multi-arts activities. Impact

After School Arts Program

In collaboration with youth service agency partners in over twenty sites across three regions, CKA's anchor After School Arts Program facilitated quality arts activities for over 600 children. Many of our programs exist to engage children and youth at crucial times when parents are still at work. Our programs connect with young people ripe for activities unique to after school and summer environments. We are proud that we can contribute these services in multiple sites over three regions, and we look forward to developing deeper engagement with current and new partners in the youth and health services sectors.

Artasia

Artasia 2017: "I Have a Right", our Canada 150th anniversary project, animated our engagement with children, youth, families, artists, and the wider community. Supported by all levels of government, foundations, corporate and community partners, this project highlighted the City of Hamilton Charter of Rights for Children and Youth. Over 500 children and youth from three regions reached out to engage 150 notable Canadians in a larger conversation about their rights.

The culminating interactive multimedia artwork created by Tyler Tekatch and his team of media artists exhibited at the Art Gallery of Hamilton in late 2017. Once again, we were reminded by our youngest citizens what it means to live with dignity, respect and inclusivity. This project also pointed the way to the potential impact of integrating arts with technology. When you combine the energy of creativity with the power of technology, local and global conversations and art making are not only possible; they are inevitable.

Arts For All

In the final year of the Ontario Trillium Foundation funded Arts for All collaboration, CKA connected with established and emerging artists and trained them to mentor partner agency staff to ensure an appropriately stimulating environment for specialized arts activities. Artists and Arts Educators mentored agency staff to gain a greater understanding of how to best support specialized multi-arts activities. By providing quality programming and sharing our methods, we have noticed a change in attitude in the youth service sector about the primary importance of arts education.

Culture for Kids in the Arts (CKA) was founded in 1999 by Vitek Wincza, Founder and Artistic Director of the Hamilton Conservatory for the Arts, a unique environment for programs in dance, music, visual, theatre and media arts. Under the artistic leadership of Wincza, CKA continues to experience steady growth while ensuring accessibility to quality arts programming for children and youth. CKA operates out of a historic arts education building in a shared facility that represents a vibrant cultural hub and is recognized for its innovative and accessible arts programming for children and youth. CKA has delivered interactive arts programs to over 50.000 local children and vouth.



We listen by basing our programming on their interests from year to year.

Many nations, including Canada, have not paid enough attention to children's rights. In 2015, CKA workd with the CLy of Hamilton Best Start Network (Hamilton Early Years) together with children and youth in Hamilton, to develop a renewed Charter of Rights of Children and Youth. These rights were born through their voices:

I nave the right to be heads to live in a nome, in a neighbourdood to live in and be cared to by family, to have finands, to and food, and warm, cl observations and thoughts without judgment, to learn more things to me holices to special help like a whethar if I aver need it, to know about a practice my culture, to care for living things, to be safe, secure, and head to be free from discrimination, to rest; to be praced whethar in more than the second section of which am.











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What will you do to enact these rights?

In order to activate these rights, both children and adults have participatory responsibilities (Hamilton Best Start, 2015). These can include actions like listening to others when they speak, speaking out when we witness hate and bigotry, or helping to take care of our neighbourhoods by picking up garbage.

Hamilton Charter of Rights of Children and Youth

The Hamilton Early Years system supports the belief that all children and youth have rights. The Hamilton Charter of Rights of Children and Youth was created with the input of over 2000 children and youth firm Hamilton, in their words, through extensive community engagement. Participatory respectively were added to open conversations between adults and respectively.

The Charter was released in 2015. A tour of the children's artwork and celebrations of the charter occurred throughout the City of Hamilton to engage the community in discussions about rights and building awareness.

The Charter is not only about making Hamilton the best place to raise a child, but also about making Hamilton the best place to be a child.

Hamilton Parent Charter of Rights

The Hamilton Early Years system is also about supporting parents and families to provide children with the best possible opportunities early in their lives. Parents are the first, most important and most lasting teachers in a child's life.

In 2010, a Hamilton Parent Charter of Rights was created The Charter: • sets out shared principles and beliefs for providers to guide them around planning and disking parents that values gueras that values despectively. • reflects the voice of the community, developed through extensive public consultation and feedback: • provides a strong foundation for the future of families, service providers, and organizations that serve parents in hamilton.
