

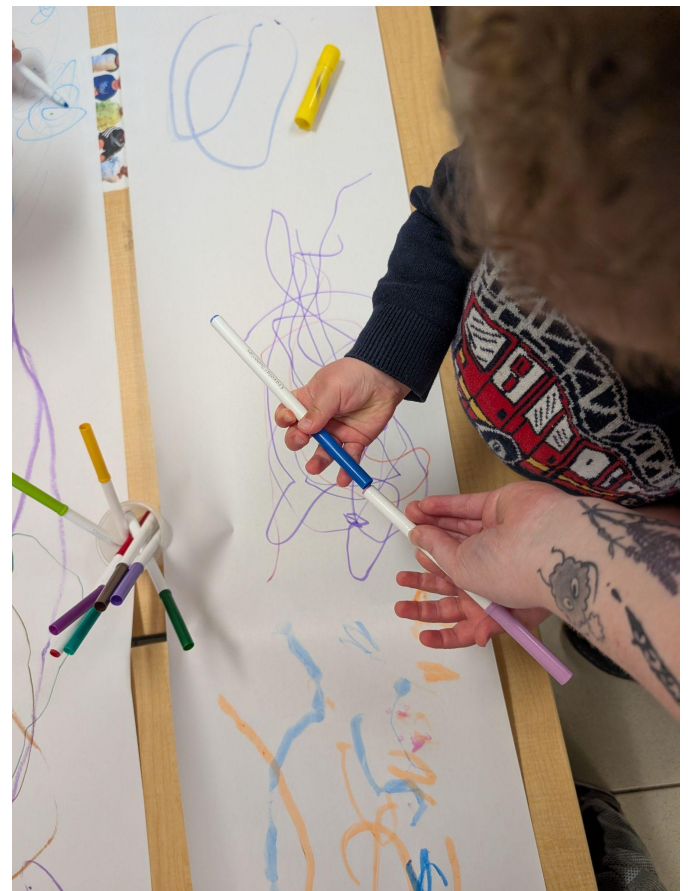

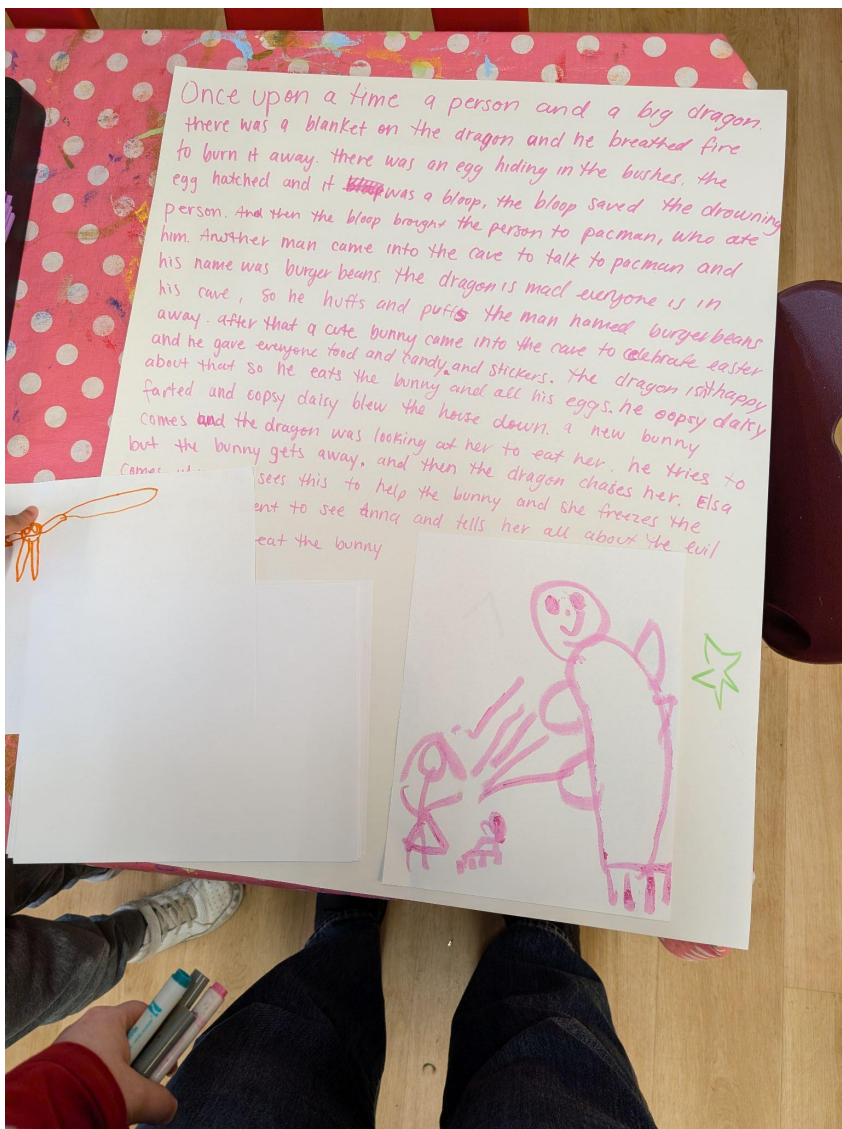

We explored so many different materials and mediums together like printmaking, sculptures, chalk pastels, storytelling and we even created a giant web with the children acting as spiders decorating it all together. I found that no matter what the supplies they were given were even if they were new this group was capable of turning it into amazing works, showing their amazing perseverance and creativity.
